7. What were the findings for this academic year? (2019-2020)

Passing grade for this course is 77%. The class average was a 90.4%. With the lowest score being a 65% and the highest being a 99%. 27 out of 31 students were successful in meeting the passing grade of 77%.

Effects of change in curriculum include increased patient care and outcomes, increased patient safety and less instances of incident reports.
