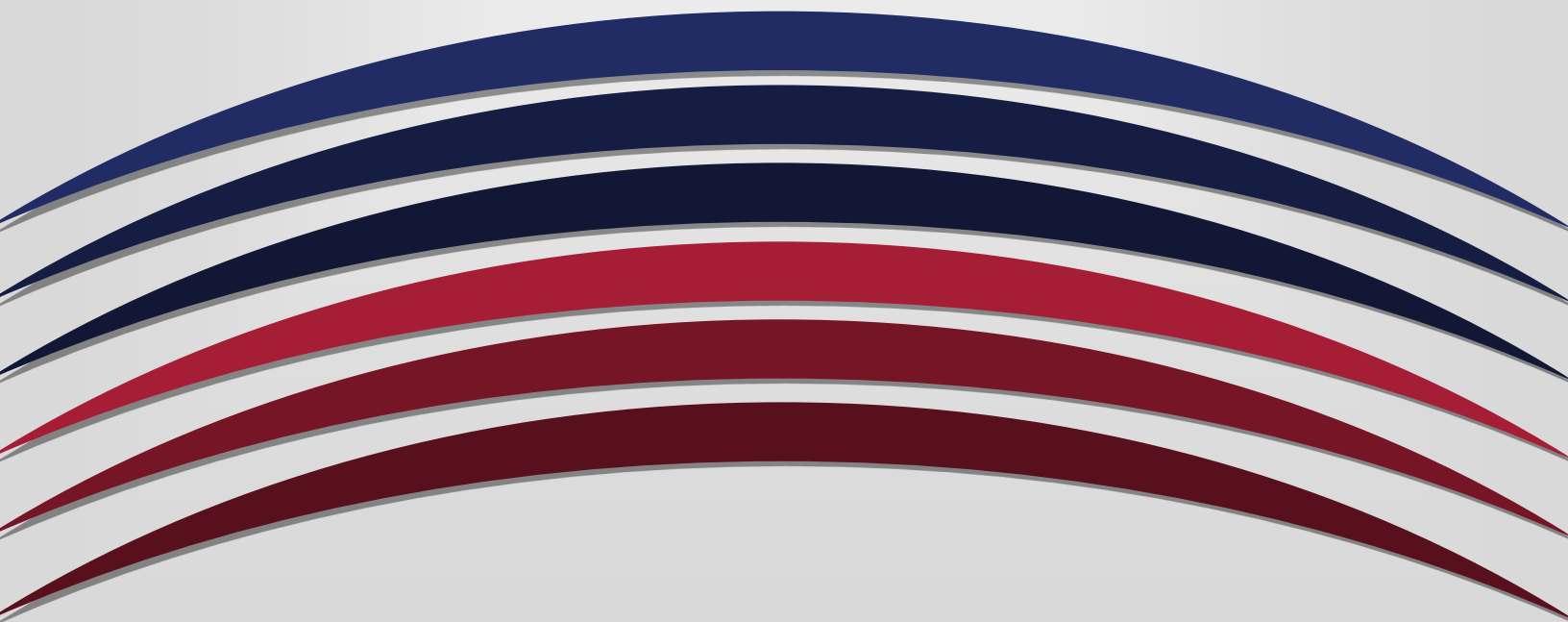

5. What is your analysis of the findings?

Students continue to excel in clinical rotations with grades averaging in the 85-100% range. Some students withdrew from clinical due to withdrawing from lecture potentially skewing results.

In 2020-2021, enrollment in the program was 68 in August 2020 with 31 graduating in August 2021 and 10 students remained in the program as Non-

Traditional students and graduated in May 2022 along with 29 Traditional students.

6. What is the action plan for the upcoming academic year?
