3. Explain the assessment cycle.

The assessment test is given every semester as a required portion of the final exam in all PSYC 2300 courses. Results are calculated and all full-time psychology instructors meet to discuss the results to be sure the 75% success rate is met in all categories.





If the success rate is not met, the full-time faculty discuss how to improve the scores within that specific section. Faculty members also use this time to discuss adding additional assessment materials and recommend any edits/updates for the assessment test.

4. What are the assessment methods? Are they direct or indirect?

Direct assessment methods used as a final exam in the course. Discussion has begun to include other types of assessment, including adding a final project, practical application and writing assignments.

5. What are the assessment goal(s), including benchmarks?

The assessment goals include assuring that all students meet the 75% success rate for each learning objective.

6. What were the findings for the academic year?

7. What is your analysis of the findings?

All categories met or exceeded the 75% success rate criteria for FA/SP 2021-22 school year! The results are an improvement from last year's findings, which demonstrated a 73% success rate for the area of "research." The psychology assessment test is a living document and faculty meet each semester to edit, update and/or replace questions to improve the assessment test's relevancy and reliability. This improvement is correlated with faculty continued efforts to improve success rates in all areas, specifically research methods. The "concurrent" category was added this year; the course was taught by Instructor Michael Loya.

8. What is the action plan for the upcoming academic year? Explain.

The action plan consists of continuing use of the final exam portion of assessment and, beginning in Spring 2022 adding the use of 3 writing assignments with rubrics. Faculty have begun implementing the writing assignments this fall but will use this semester to develop rubrics for collecting data in the spring.

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
