For all webpages, YouTube videos, blogs, and tweets remember the following:

- When listing a URL, leave off the http://
- Use Permalinks, if available, instead of a URL.
- Including the date that you accessed the website is optional

Citing a Web Page

Lastname, Firstname. "Webpage." *Website*. Publisher, Date of Publication, Permalink or URL. Accessed Date.

Barney, Alicia. "Who needs a flu vaccine?" *WebMD*, symptoms.webmd.com/cold-and-flu-map-tool/flu-vaccines-explained. Accessed 8 Aug. 2022.

Citing a Youtube video

Author's Name. "Title of Image or Video." *YouTube*, uploaded by uploader's name, date of posting.

Permalink or URL.

Kim, Christine Sun. "The Enchanting Music of Sign Language." *YouTube*, uploaded by TEDTalks, 19 Nov. 2015. youtu.be/2Euof4PnjDk.

Citing a listserv, discussion group, or blog posting

Author, or compiler name if available. "Posting Title." *Name of Site*. Version number if available. Name of institution/organization affiliated with the site (sponsor or publisher). URL. Date of access.

Citing a Tweet

Twitter username. "tweet in its entirety." *Twitter*, Date of posting, time of posting. URL.
