

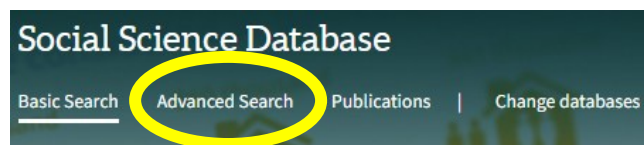
Advanced Searching in the Social Science database

Social Science database is a ProQuest database that focuses on articles on social science disciplines including anthropology, criminology, psychology, and more.

To get to **Social Science** start on the **UA-PTC Libraries** homepage: <http://www.uaptc.edu/library>.

- Click on the **A-Z Databases** icon.
- Select **Social Science** from the alphabetical list of databases.

Social Science opens to a Basic Search screen with a single search box. To do a more advanced search click on **Advanced Search** in the ProQuest menu:



To see how **Social Science** works let's search for articles on **scarification** and **gender**.

Type the topic, **scarification**, in the top search box.

Type the second topic, **gender** in the second search box.

The **AND** box tells **Social Science** database to look for both topics in each article.

The next screen displays your search results in order of relevance. Limit your results using the **Narrow Results** menu options to limit by **Source Type, Publication Date, Subject**, etc.

Choose an article and click on the underlined title to view the full text.

Use the buttons to **download, print, or cite** the article.

The AI powered **Research Assistant** has several different tools including summaries, additional ideas and sources, and much more.

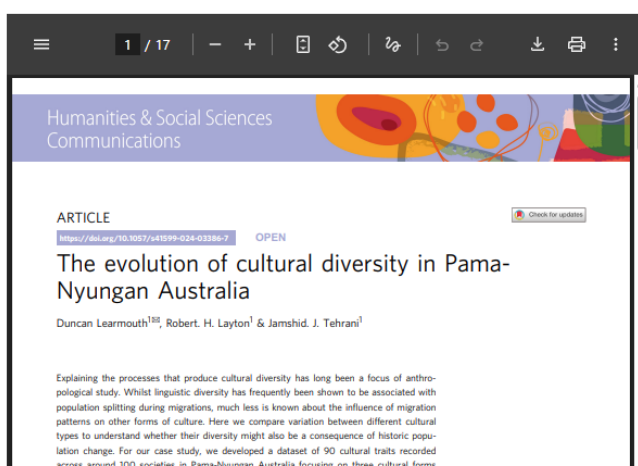
