1.0 PURPOSE

The Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1989, Public Law 101-226, requires that, as a condition of receiving funds or any other form of financial assistance under federal program, an institution must certify that it has adopted and implemented a program to prevent the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol by students and employees.

The policy of UA-PTC clearly establishes that use, possession, or sale of illicit drugs and alcohol on College premises or at institutional functions will not be tolerated.
